

SCOUT ACCOUNTS AND FUNDRAISING

Scout Accounts

Upon joining, your son will be set up with a Scout Account with the Troop. This account can be used for any purchases related to Scouting. Proceeds from fundraising will be deposited and withdrawals can be made in two ways:

1. Pay for camp, dues and fees by indicating the desire to use your Scout Account.
2. Be reimbursed for uniform or scout purchases by submitting receipt to the treasurer.

Scout accounts are for scouting related purchases only. Scouts whose registration lapses forfeit any remaining balance. The Troop reserves the right to utilize funds from a Scout account to pay any unpaid or overdue balance.



Holiday Greens

October - November
Each fall, scouts are provided with sales information to sell Holiday Greens. Or-

ders are taken throughout the month. Delivery occurs in December. All proceeds are deposited in your son's Scout Account, usually around 33%.



King Soopers Gift Cards

Trails-End Popcorn Sale

September - October
Each year the Council offers a Popcorn sale to all Scouts. If your son already has a customer list from Cub Scouts, he may find the program worth continuing. Scouts receive all proceeds, usually around 30%.
